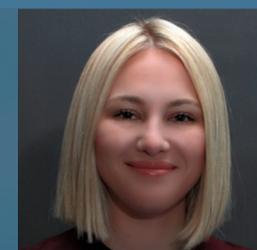

Field Training Research and Conducting an Experiment in an Academy Setting

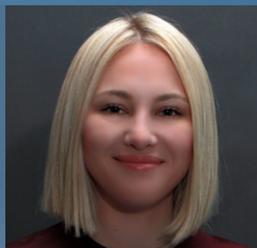
