Enclosure (1) is attached and forwarded for your information and use. It is the first quarter CY07 update to CNA's *Integrated Ship Database (ISDB)*.

Other attached enclosures include: a "READ ME FIRST" file that describes basic features of the database and steps to take when first opening it [Encl (2)]; the distribution list for this version of the database [Encl (3)]; and the original database user's manual from December 2005 [Encl (4)].

This version of the database incorporates the following changes:

- We updated the Naval Vessel Register (NVR) data through 31 March 2007.
 - The data from the MSC Ship Inventory reflects changes as of 31 March 2007.
 - The Maritime Administration's Property Management and Archive Record System (PMARS) data is current as of 30 April 2007.
- Over time, we want to more comprehensively cross-reference the various source databases. In this version of ISDB, we have added links from PMARS for historical ships in the NVR with *Stricken* or *Disposed* status.

In addition, we re-structured the Pivot Table to more easily display the data by the force categories defined in the Navy's Ships and Aircraft Data Supplemental Tables (SASDT).¹ This information is presented in ISDB's *Force* field. Previously, the Pivot Table contained the data by force category in hidden columns.

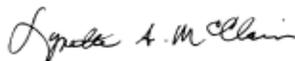
Figure 1. Opening display of Pivot Table.

In this version, we present the data in the visible table controlled by two "page" menus in the upper left hand section of the worksheet. Now the Pivot Table first appears as in figure 1.

The "page" controls reside in rows 1 and 2 and columns A and B. If you select the drop-down menu for *SASDT Force Categories* from cell B1, you will see the display in figure 2. Figure 3 shows the drop-down menu from cell B2 for sorting by the entries in the *Force* field.

In a sample sort, we have selected *Ship Battle Forces* under *SASDT Force Category*: Figure 4 shows the result. The grand total of 276 ships reflects the count of *Deployable Battle Force Ships* shown on the *Status of the Navy* page [Ref (a)] on the Navy's official web site, *Navy.mil* and that of *Ship Battle Forces* on the *Fleet Size* page [Ref (b)] of the NVR web site.
