While disinformation is widely recognized as a problem – and one with significant national security implications – the ways that disinformation intersects with racism, sexism, and other biases and stereotypes is discussed less often. During this event, our speakers will explore the impacts of disinformation on communities of color, and in particular on Asian American communities.

Our upcoming event— **How Disinformation Divides Communities of Color**—will take place on Wednesday May 17, 12:00-1:00 ET via Zoom, and our keynote speakers will be **Dr. Jonathan Ong**, University of Massachusetts-Amherst Professor and Andrew Carnegie Fellow, and **Kavitha Rajagopalan**, City University of New York's Center for Community Media's Asian Media Initiative Director. The event will be moderated by **Dr. Megan K. McBride**, a Research Scientist at CNA and Research Associate at the Harvard T.H. Chan School of Public Health.

The event will explore the following questions, along with many others: How do disinformation campaigns activate long-existing racial tensions and resentments? What harms are done at the individual and community levels by disinformation campaigns? What, if anything, can be done—by government, private organizations, media, and community networks—to increase resilience to disinformation?
