Christian Quinn completed a 24-year law enforcement career in 2021, retiring as a Major from the Fairfax County (VA) Police Department. He led the establishment of a new Cyber & Forensics Bureau to account for emergent trends related to digital investigations and operational technology. He was also responsible for numerous other key technical initiatives including body-worn cameras, unmanned aerial systems, and implementing a mobile crime lab program. Christian was assigned to the Organized Crime & Intelligence Bureau for much of his early career, where he had the opportunity to collaborate with state, local, and federal partners to ensure the safety of the Washington National Capital Region.

Christian has been a featured speaker throughout the U.S. and internationally, advising legislators, public safety leaders and the industry partners who serve them on key policy and product issues. He remains engaged with several law enforcement associations and serves on the International Association of Chiefs of Police Communications & Technology Committee, and as Chair of the Cyber sub-committee. He has authored articles and policies on a host of topics including cyber security, digital crime, domestic extremism, and business aspects of public sector technology programs.

Christian holds a Master of Forensic Sciences Degree from The George Washington University and has completed several executive development programs. He is a 2018 graduate of the FBI National Academy in Quantico, Virginia.
