At the federal level, agencies such as the Department of Justice, Bureau of Justice Assistance, National Institute of Justice, and Office of Community Oriented Policing Services can benefit from these tools to support grant making, technical assistance, and research initiatives. State criminal justice agencies, including departments of corrections, attorney generals' offices, and state courts, can use decision tools for implementation support, compliance tracking, and cost justification. Local entities, such as sheriffs' offices, police departments, probation offices, district attorneys' offices, and public defenders, can leverage these tools for real-time assessments, policy rollouts, and budgeting. By using decision tools, these justice leaders will enhance their operational readiness, strategic planning, and community accountability.
