How to play

Select a Card Tsar
The inaugural *Card Tsar* is the person who was most recently the closest to Russia.

Select prompt
Card Tsar selects a prompt. It could be a world event, a cost imposition, or even a NATO response card. You're the *Card Tsar*, you pick.

Counterplay
(Optional rule)
After a card wins, *Card Tsar* selects that card as the prompt and deals from the corresponding deck for players to select responses.

Fine print
Consider this game your comedic crash course in geopolitical shenanigans: how might Russia create headaches for NATO, and how might NATO alleviate them? Think of this game as the appetizer to the main course of real-world discussions, just with a lot more laughs and fewer diplomatic incidents.

Democracy
All players vote on the best card. The card with the most votes wins, and the *Card Tsar* breaks all ties.

Read & Deal
Card Tsar reads selected prompt aloud and deals all other players at least 5 cards from another deck. Use the cost imposition (red) deck for world events (brown) or NATO response (blue). Use the NATO response (blue) deck for cost imposition (red) prompts.

Players submit
Players select one of their cards and submit it face down to the *Card Tsar*.

Autocracy
Card Tsar declares the best card.

Game End
Game ends when *Card Tsar* says it ends. Count all players' face-up cards. Player with most wins.

The Kremlin's Favorite
(Optional rule)
Card Tsar adds a random face-down card along with the players' submissions, increasing the chance no one wins this round.
