#### What is strategic planning?

Strategic planning is a comprehensive approach designed to help justice agencies chart a clear path to achieving their short- or long-term goals and enhancing their operational effectiveness. A strategic plan may focus on a larger outcome, such as public safety, or focus narrowly on topics such as firearm crime, community engagement, technology, or victim services and support. A plan may be developed for one or more agencies and include a collaborative approach involving multiple relevant stakeholders.

By aligning resources, policies, and initiatives with the agency's mission and vision, strategic planning enables justice organizations to improve public safety, foster community trust, and adapt to evolving legal and societal landscapes. CNA's strategic planning support can help your department execute the following:

- Develop a sustainable roadmap for reducing crime and victimization in your communities.
- Establish a detailed, focused approach with specific strategies, roles, and responsibilities to better address crime and sustain existing effective practices.
- Create a transparent and unified strategy for messaging to both internal stakeholders and the community.
- Measure the success and effects of your efforts.

# Who should engage in strategic planning?

Strategic planning is applicable to a wide range of justice organizations and agencies and can include multidisciplinary partners and community stakeholders. Stakeholders may include local, state, and federal law enforcement agencies; sheriff's offices; small, rural, or tribal agencies; city governments; prosecutors; parole or probation departments; correctional organizations; and community organizations. The planning process can also include individuals from all levels of an organization.
