## **Expanding the US-Flag Fleet and Shipbuilding Base**

Rebuilding America's commercial fleet and shipyard industrial base is a top priority for strengthening national security. The ability to build and operate more US-flagged ships for trade and military sealift will reduce reliance on foreign shipping and ensure sufficient logistics support to our armed forces when crises arise. Recent bipartisan initiatives have set bold goals: expanding the US-flag fleet by hundreds of vessels within a decade and revitalizing shipyards across the country.

Achieving these objectives will require strategic analysis to identify effective incentives, policies, and investments. CNA is already at the forefront of this effort: the US Maritime Administration (MARAD) selected CNA to lead an analysis informing the new National Maritime Strategy, aimed at revitalizing the US merchant marine and maritime industrial base. In this role, CNA has been engaging public and private stakeholders to pinpoint the elements of a successful long-term strategy.

Our analysts bring expertise in sealift and fleet composition modeling, helping determine the optimal mix of vessels and support programs to meet defense and commercial needs. We also apply wargaming to stress-test how a larger US fleet would perform in various conflict or crisis scenarios, ensuring that expansion plans translate to real capability. CNA has analyzed regulatory reforms and cost drivers to make US-built vessels more cost effective. By providing evidence-based recommendations—such as how to structure vessel financing or cargo preference rules— CNA gives lawmakers and officials a roadmap to grow the fleet sustainably. Our support to Navy and Coast Guard leadership over the years, including work on fleet architecture and cutter mix, means CNA is uniquely qualified to advise on a future force structure that integrates Navy warships, Coast Guard cutters, and merchant shipping into one, coherent maritime force. In short, CNA delivers the analytics and strategic vision to expand the US-flag fleet and rekindle America's shipbuilding might.
